RIAA has reported to us that you are allegedly in violation of copyright law for the following:

If you have not done so within 72 hours or if this illegal activity persists, you will be placed on social probation and you will lose Bowdoin Internet access from your personal computer.

Of course, legal copying of material, such as iTunes or Napster, is permitted.
